It's an end of an era as Amazon has decided to discontinue their Amazon smile charitable giving program. From a PTA perspective, this is disappointing as it was an excellent passive income earner which allowed the parent and community to support us. Last year we raised over £400. The PTA has started looking at switching it's focus to other things to fill this gap including **easyfundraising** which is like a cashback site but contributions go to the PTA. If you haven't already signed up the PTA committee would ask you to consider signing up and supporting the PTA through this platform.

Easyfundraising is a UK-based online fundraising platform that allows charities, schools, sports clubs, and other non-profit organizations to raise funds by partnering with various online retailers. When supporters of these organizations shop online through the Easyfundraising website, a percentage of the purchase price is donated by the retailer to the organization as a commission. Easyfundraising works with over 4,000 retailers, including Amazon, eBay, John Lewis, Tesco, and Argos, among others. The platform is free to use for both supporters and organizations, and has helped raise millions of pounds for good causes since its launch in 2005.

470 bus route problems and campaign for improvement

Does your daughter use the 470 bus route to get to Nonsuch High School? Or would she be willing to use it if it was more frequent and reliable? My daughter is reliant on this bus route, and it is the only reasonable public transport option to Nonsuch High School for those living in Belmont, South Cheam, Ewell, and possibly other areas near the school.

Unfortunately, if you do use it, you know that the girls often miss the first bus towards Sutton after school (it is scheduled to arrive at 15:17 but is frequently slightly early), often wait a long time for the next bus which is late or sometimes too full to pick up the girls in Cheam. I understand it's not much better if you are coming from Ewell!

This happens because the route runs at 30-minute intervals. It is not reasonable for our daughters to wait 45 minutes+ or so for a bus to get home, especially in winter if they are doing any after school clubs. Whilst a lot of girls still use this route, I am sure that many have given up and are organising lift shares or just driving their daughters to school. This might be more reliable, but it puts pressure on working parents to drive, and increases traffic in Cheam, which is a very small village for the size of the school. Congestion near the school and park increases the risks of all our girls being involved in road traffic accidents. And really, as the distance is only 1-2 miles for most, it should be easily manageable by public transport in the suburban London and Surrey borders!

You may not be aware, but Transport for London had agreed to increase this bus route to 3 times per hour from late 2022. I think this would make all the difference if it took place, at least at peak times, but this change in schedule has been delayed until 2024 due to lack of funds at TFL and could be delayed longer.

I have contacted the Belmont counsellors (Jane Pascoe) who I found supportive and persuaded TFL to do a survey last year. TFLs survey showed no problems on the 470-bus route but as best we can tell they did not conduct their survey at peak times!

I hope that the ULEZ extension (whether we agree with it or not) could be an opportunity to improve local public transport. I know that many parents have contacted local counsellors or MPs and would urge others to do so. We are also trying to get TFL to do more surveys, but this does not capture potential users who have already given up on this route hence this newsletter request. My aim is to get TFL to prioritise making this route more frequent at least at peak times, and I hope this is achievable given it is something they had already agreed to do before the funding crisis.
