

PTA Fundraising Update 2022-2023

With your help, the PTA has managed to raise £8,000 in income in the first term of this academic year. The key drivers for this were Chandra's walking challenge and the Christmas raffle, both were tremendously successful. We also ran a Krispy Kreme doughnut day where we sold 1200 doughnuts. This was very popular with pupils. The 200+ Club is still our bread and butter earning £2005. Preloved uniform continues to be a solid revenue stream for the PTA with £362 taken. The preloved uniform also provides much-needed uniform to the parent and carer community at an affordable price whilst also encouraging recycling where some uniform would end up in landfill. The PTA Refreshments stall took £205 at the Christmas concert. Is the information on the internet improving our children's intelligence or is it an immoral platform destroying the youth's innocence?

Research shows that 53% of children in the UK own a mobile phone by age seven. 57% of respondents sleep with their mobile devices beside their bed.

Parents often ask themselves, should I allow my teen to spend time browsing the Internet and sign up on social media platforms?

This depends on the age of the child and the social platform's age restriction. Both Internet and social media could be used positively by young people. There are many benefits of children using the Internet and Social media. Spending some time online is crucial for the digital generation to access homework online, researching for school project and most importantly for them to stay connected with friends. Imagine a world without the Internet during lockdown. How else would we have communicated and connected to family and friends? How could we possibly have entertained these little minions confined inside our homes 24/7? Young people can collaborate and learn in a more peer-based method where they are motivated to learn from each other. Learning can now come from newer sources and not just from parents or teachers. Even they pick up some skills from playing games moderately. It is said that playing video games improves handeye coordination. It is also a sense of escapism from school work and having an hour break after school could be harmless.

However, we know that excessive playing can lead to addiction which can ultimately cause mental illness and eating disorder. Spending long time in front of any device could be detrimental and can cause eye astigmatism to anyone. Too much media can certainly interfere with children's daily lives such as getting enough exercise, completing homework, spending time with family and socialising with friends face to face. Information overload, fake news and misinformation is another area of concern. But most significantly meeting catfishes, talking to strangers and pornography are some of the most harmful.

How do we balance giving access and at the same time setting limits?

This is an absolutely individual family decision. Nevertheless, most parents do feel setting screen time limits and setting privacy measures on social media is crucial. Schools do some of the parenting for us as they learn about Internet Safety and Bullying online. However, monitoring our children at home especially young ones and teens is vital for their health and safety.



Some may argue that this is a privacy intrusion against children's rights. Others may say this is not about being intrusive and reading every message between young people, but more about monitoring your child's safety. Snapchat for example lets parents monitor who their child is talking to. Monitoring alone is not helpful if your child doesn't understand the consequences. Having conversations with young people about the dangers out will help in keeping them safe.

I once came across an article that says "Parents of the social media generation are not OK". This grabbed my attention and it made me reflect on how my generation did not grow up with spending their childhood with social media apps and are now struggling to understand and navigate the potential harms that social media can have on their kids' mental health as they grow up. I mean, the Internet did not come with a manual or instruction book and nor did our children. Google's Family Link and Microsoft Family Safety apps are free and great examples of many applications that enable parents to set screen time limits and age restrictions on children devices.

Why tech inventors do not let their kids use the gadgets and apps they develop?

Many parents were furious when the late Steve jobs declared publicly that his kids don't use the iPad he created and that he set strict on-screen time limits for his children. The question comes on your mind is then why it is advertised as a child friendly device? He is not alone. Lots of Silicon Valley parents discourage the use of devices beyond necessity and prefer physical activity, reading, art and experiential learning for their kids. Bill Gates, the founder of Microsoft didn't let his kids get mobile phones until they turned 14. What do we learn from this as parents?

To conclude there are benefits and drawbacks of the use technology overall and parents need to balance between allow their children to make good use of technology while protecting them from dangerous materials.
