All of which got me thinking about our children, what they take away from all this and how they -- and we -- respond. It may go against the grain, but I'm actually positive. That's not to downplay the extent of the challenges we face. ALL MONEY RAISED GOES TO BENEFIT OUR DAUGHTERS What does that mean? Well, at one level it can mean mending, re-using and re-cycling wherever possible, rather than resorting to buying something new online simply because it's cheaper and easier, or because Amazon encourages us to do so. Or it can mean giving up little habits that you barely even noticed you'd adopted until you started counting the cost. For example, I go into London two or three times a week for work and almost always buy at least one cup of coffee while I'm there (usually from Pret, but other coffee shops are available). The price of a Pret coffee recently went up to more than £3, which made me realise I was sometimes spending £15 a week on coffee, or up to £60 a month. As well as potentially covering several school trips, that's more than a monthly subscription to Netflix, Disney+ and Amazon Prime combined, which seems excessive at multiple levels. I'm drinking much less coffee. But it's not just those small and relatively superficial things. It's about fundamentally rethinking what our needs and priorities are. Those that are best able to boil down what's needed to its absolute essence, and prioritise that one thing against other distractions, are the ones that ultimately are most successful, whether in business, academia, government, sports or any other discipline. What's more, the creativity and lateral thinking required to come up with a solution that doesn't just involve spending money to resolve a problem are exactly the sorts of skills any of us would want to see in our daughters, and future potential employers are pretty keen to see, too. In that respect, and despite its hardships, the cost-of-living crisis is a chance to reboot and refocus. When my daughters hear headlines about it on the radio or read about it in The Week, I hope it's an opportunity to learn about money, managing finances (in their own small way), and what they might want to save for or prioritize, rather than feeling panicked and concerned. And I also try to remind myself that, like all times of difficulty, this too will pass.
