I'm so thankful for the oppurtunity to personally contribute in making a difference for the better and i'm looking forward to fundraising for Child Rescue Nepal. I'll now be busy training and fundrasing for the run on 2nd October 2022.

Any contributions you can make are hugely appreciated, I really am thankful for all the help and support! Why I'm raising money for Child Rescue Nepal The Charity has been rescuing and caring for vulnerable children in Nepal since 1999 who are either being exploited or at risk of being Trafficked.

The Charities work consists of Recuing Children, Reuniting families, care and support and prevention. Child Rescue Nepal Impact

- Raised over £7 million for Nepal's children.
- Rescued over 850 children, with ongoing support in many cases.
- Pursued the prosecution of 24 traffickers, helping to jail 14 in Nepal and India.
- Supported a case in the High Court against a well-known Nepali trafficker.
- Currently caring for 42 children in our small family-style homes.
- Improved education for 50,000 children in the trafficking-prone district, Makwanpur.
- Raised £150,000 for earthquake relief in 2015 and delivered a comprehensive school reconstruction program." Donate here

FUNDRAISING UPDATE

The Nonsuch High School PTA runs a series of events throughout the year to engage and support parents and raise funds for the school. While we slowly moved away from the most challenging funding year faced in 2020/21, we continued to be restricted and thus maintained online PTA meetings primarily. However, this did not prevent us from arranging a number of new and well established fundraising events. They all were met with positive feedback as well as generating net funds into the PTA coffers resulting in another successful financial year.

For the financial year 2021/22, the PTA ended the year with a net surplus of over £12,700 on its Income and Expenditure account. This was up from the £7,700 surplus made the previous year. In addition, cash balances in the PTA accounts were also increased from the previous year – a reflection of successful fundraising activities as well as managing expenditure prudently.

Only some of our activities and funding for the academic year 2020/2021 are highlighted below to just give a flavour.

The '200+ Club' draw is a cornerstone activity in raising funds and this year, despite continued challenging circumstances, we raised a net amount in excess of £4300. The PTA Committee organised a Preloved Uniform Sale generating net sales of nearly £2700. A very successful Quiz night was put on in the school hall which produced funds close to £900. This was despite the questions being a lot harder than expected! The Krispy Kreme Doughnut Sale is always a firm favourite, especially with the students and this helped raise nearly £1000. The Virtual Balloon Race was a new and online race activity which generated a fair amount of interest (and a competitive streak in some!) leading to an income of over £700. The Murder Mystery Event was another new event put on for the first time and raised £1000 income. This year the PTA has raised in excess of £500 through the shopping channels including the Amazon Smile programme, and we thank the parents for signing up for it.
