#### Bar Mock Trial - Nonsuch students rise to the challenge in the Crown Court

On Saturday December 2nd, 16 Y12 teams from across London converged on Snaresbrook Crown Court in north-east London, in the London regional heat of the national Bar Mock Trial Competition.
