### Attendance

Every day in education counts. Missed lessons leads to missed understanding, and in an academically selective school such as Nonsuch, this can lead to added pressure placed onto the student.

Data suggests that those students who have an attendance figure of 95% or greater will achieve higher grades academically. Attendance at 90% or below is considered as persistent absence by the government and over a school year that student would lose 95 hours of learning time.

#### Thank you for your continued support to ensure your child attends school.

You can monitor your child's attendance data through the Schoolgateway app and ensure that it remains at 95% and above. If there is anything that we may be concerned about, your child's form tutor, Head of Year or myself will contact you.

#### **Operation Encompass**

#### What is Operation Encompass?

Operation Encompass is a collaborative procedure involving various agencies that aims to provide timely support for children and young people who have witnessed domestic abuse in their homes.

Partnershipworking:OperationEncompass involves partnerships betweenthe Metropolitan Police, local authorities,and designated safeguarding leads inschools. By working together, these partiesensure that appropriate steps are taken tosupport students who have experienceddomestic abuse.

**Information sharing**: The Metropolitan Police notifies the designated safeguarding leads within schools about any domestic abuse incidents where a child or young person was present. This allows the school to adjust their approach and provide necessary support during what could be a challenging day emotionally. The information shared includes the date and time of the incident and a notification of the previous day's domestic incident.

**Supplemental protocol**: It is important to note that this protocol does not replace existing procedures or solely address child welfare. It should always be followed alongside current safeguarding measures. PERATION ENCOMPASS In every force. In every school. For every child.

Operation Encompass serves as an additional means reinforce to safeguarding practices and ensure the wellbeing of children after a domestic incident. Schools can this use knowledge to offer immediate silent observation and awareness, with any further needs being addressed through standard pastoral care processes.

**Disclosure details**: The information disclosed through Operation Encompass pertains to instances where the child was present during a domestic incident involving their parents, resulting in police involvement.

**Disclosure process**: This information is securely sent to specially trained designated safeguarding leads in school, Mrs Hart and Mrs Williamson-Jones on the following morning after the incident occurred.
