#### Lectures:

- Big lecture theatre
- Bulk of your contact hours

#### Seminars/tutorials:

- Smaller group classes
- Discuss and debate lecture content

#### Practicals/labs:

- Application of lecture/tutorial content
- Take up to 3/6 hours

#### Assessments:

- Vary depending on course
- Weighted differently depending on course

#### How to choose your room

- Accommodation application portal opens in December each year!

## **Citizens of Change Scholarship**

#### What's on offer?

- □ 25 scholarships: £15,000 (£5,000 per year for the first 3 years of your course).
- □ 50 scholarships: £7,500 (£2,500 per year for the first 3 years of your course).

#### Who is eligible?

- Any student who has applied to the University of Leicester and holds an offer to study with us on a full time campus-based undergraduate course starting in September 2024.
- Successful applicants will need to have made Leicester their firm choice and have met the conditions of their offer

#### How do I apply?

- □ Create a short video (60 seconds max.) that answers the question: "What do you want to change?". The video must be in portrait orientation we suggest making use of TikTok or Instagram Reels.

- You have a maximum of 5 choices
- But if you chose Medicine, Dentistry or Vet Science then you have a maximum of 4
