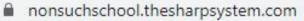
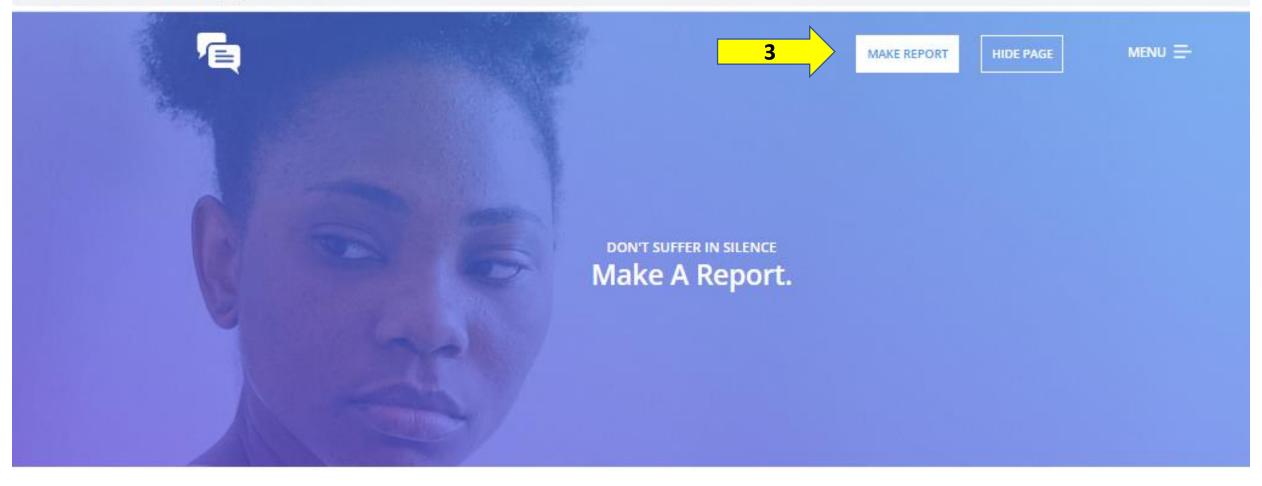
reminders about online and remote learning (January 2021)

- You must not share your remote learning login details with any person inside or
 outside the school. You must keep passwords private as otherwise you will be held
 accountable for anything that happens on your account.
- You must not share a link for a lesson with another student inside or outside the school. This will be treated as a serious breach of the school's Behaviour Policy.
- Do report any safeguarding concerns in the usual way through SHARP, to your form tutor or your Head of Year or via the Integrated Bullying and Discrimination form on FROG.
- Please continue to use email etiquette when communicating with staff (e.g. correct form of address, appropriate language in the email – if you wouldn't say it to the person, don't write it – and an appropriate ending).
- Be aware that staff will take appropriate action in lessons to allow the effective teaching of the rest of the class. This may include exiting a student from a lesson if necessary.
- Let your teachers know if you are going to be late, have an appointment or cannot access the lesson for technical difficulties.
- If you are submitting work past the deadline, send an appropriate apology.
- Be patient if you ask teachers questions via email you'd be surprised how many emails teachers are receiving each day.
- Remember that the school has many services on offer to help you (including our school counsellor, the ELSA, an attached social worker and a Child Wellbeing Practitioner). All of these services can be accessed via your Head of Year
- And finally ... look after yourselves; get outside whenever you can; don't spend all day in front of your computer screen and be kind to yourselves, your family and your friends. This is difficult for everyone!

Two new ways to report bullying, discrimination and other safeguarding issues to teaching staff 1: The SHARP system. The form is on the school's website (drop down menu in the top right-hand corner) and allows you to report issues to do with bullying, hate crime and health, among others. You can do this confidentially, although this may make it more difficult to investigate the issue. Once completed the form is forwarded to the safeguarding team.

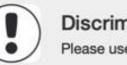
