Dear Parent/Carer & Student,

GCSE Results Day – Thursday 21 August

We are writing to you to outline the procedure for the collection of GCSE results on Thursday 21 August.

GCSE results will be available for all students to collect between 09:00 and 10:00 in the upstairs common room of the Sixth Form block. Please do not come onto the school site before 09:00.

To enter the school, please use the pedestrian gate by the canteen and enter the building by the doors opposite the nursery slope. The stairs to the upstairs common room are directly on your left as you enter the building. Members of staff will be distributing results envelopes in alphabetical order.

Parents are welcome to join their daughters to celebrate their success.

Students not collecting their results in person can arrange for a representative to collect their results, who will need to arrive at the time detailed above with a letter of authorisation, signed by the student, and some ID for themselves which must be shown to a member of the senior leadership team. All uncollected results will be posted home by first class mail at 11:00 on Thursday 21 August. We are unable to email results home.

On collection of results, we require a signature to confirm:

- The student has collected their results
- They wish to accept a place at Nonsuch Sixth Form (students not staying on at Nonsuch must confirm an alternative destination).
- They are happy for subject teachers to access their exam scripts to support teaching and learning (all scripts will be anonymised).

IMPORTANT: Subject changes will also be dealt with on the morning so if a student wishes to change A-Level choices, or they do not meet the entry criteria for the subject, they must stay onsite after receiving their results and follow the guidance in the results envelope. Please allow time for this to be processed during the morning.

In addition, if a student wishes to be considered for a 4th A-Level subject they must remain onsite, on the morning of results day, to express interest in the subject they wish to study. Please allow time for this to be processed in the morning.

Information regarding the process for requesting and making payment for post-results services will be included within your results envelope and can also be found on the school website.

We look forward to seeing you on Thursday 21 August.

Frequently asked questions:

1. What if I do not meet the entry criteria for Nonsuch Sixth Form?

In the event that a student has not met the entry criteria for our Nonsuch Sixth Form they will receive a slip of paper in with their results naming a member of staff to see on the day so that they can discuss their next steps.

2. What happens if my grades are not high enough to study my chosen subjects?

If you do not have the grades needed to study your chosen subjects, this may simply mean that you need to change your initial options to other subjects where your grades are high enough or consider the school's general entry subjects.

If you need to request a subject change, you must speak with a member of staff on the morning of results day. You will be asked to confirm which subject(s) you wish to change to. Staff will be available if you need advice with this decision.

Students must make their subject change requests on the 21 August before they leave site after receiving their GCSE results.

3. What if my grades are high enough but I want to change my A level choices?

If you meet the minimum average point score for entry to the Sixth Form, your place is secure. However, you may have decided that you wish to change one or more of your options following your GCSE results.

If you wish to request a subject change, you must speak with a member of staff on the morning of results day. You will be asked to confirm which subject(s) you wish to change to. Staff will be available if you need advice with this decision.

Students must make their subject change requests on the 21 August before they leave site after receiving their GCSE results.

Please note, changes are not guaranteed but we will do all we can to accommodate your wishes.

4. What if I wish to be considered for a fourth A-Level?

You will need to check that you meet the entry criteria for taking a fourth A-Level.

If you wish to be considered for a fourth subject, you must speak with a member of staff on the morning of results day. You will be asked to confirm which subject you wish to study as a fourth A-Level. Staff will be available if you need advice with this decision.

Students must make this request on the 21 August before they leave site after receiving their GCSE results.

Please note, studying a fourth subject is dependent on availability and is therefore not guaranteed but we will do all we can to accommodate your wishes.
