Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

I had thought that last week would be the final newsletter but during the pandemic we have learnt that changes and updates are daily so I am writing to ensure all parties go into the holidays as well informed as possible.

Today has had a suitably joyous feel as friends wish each other a good winter holiday break and take part in the various competitions dreamed up by the House Officials and the PTA in order to raise funds for a school wellbeing project – outdoor games equipment - ready for the time when students may once again be able to share such resources!

We are grateful to members of our PTA and parents and carers for the support you show the school and your children in these challenging times. They are difficult times for many families and filled with uncertainty for our young people too. To that end we attach information regarding services that young people can access over the holidays if they have concerns or are experiencing anxiety.

You will also find our Covid-19 contact tracing guide attached again for your convenience and for the safety of our school community. Please do keep us informed of any positive cases of covid-19 amongst our students or families as per the guidance attached.

We are assuming business as usual and that school will start again for the Spring term on Monday 4 January. There is considerable media speculation about a possible delay to the start of school terms, however, so in absence of any official news I am attaching the student guide to remote access so that all students can be prepared in case we have to notify you in the holidays that there is a delay to a full return to school.

Please see this reminder of expectations in the event of remote learning:

Learning from home: Guidance for students

- All lessons will be set as an assignment on Frog.
- Students must log on to Frog by 8.30 (Y7 10) or 9.15 (Y11-13) each day. By the beginning of each lesson, they must access the assignment on Frog so that they are registered present.
- Most lessons will be delivered by MS Teams and the Frog assignment will guide students to an MS Teams link. The camera must be on during a Teams lesson.
- Resources for these lessons will be shared in a variety of ways e.g. as a screen share on MS Teams, uploaded on Frog or sent by email.

Furthermore I attach a letter from Imran Choudhury, Director of Public Health for the London Borough of Sutton, encouraging secondary aged school children to carry out Covid-19 testing week commencing 27 December, prior to the return to school, in order to detect asymptomatic positive cases and prevent further spread of the virus. The letter contains information regarding how to access testing.

Finally, as the virus has taken a heavy toll on plans you may have had to celebrate religious, cultural or social events, you may take some comfort from the publication of school term and holiday dates for 2021-22 below – and shortly to be published on our website.

Roses at Nonsuch

Ever since Black History Month October, a project was being planned here at Nonsuch. This idea stemmed from the idea of unity and looking for a beautiful way to convey that message across our student body.

"Spreading love" became our slogan, a clear message of our intentions to continue to spread positivity and awareness at Nonsuch.

This campaign is in the honour of the Stephen Lawrence Charitable Trust, which is an amazing charity that "inspires and enables young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to succeed in the career of their choice", in their own words. Stephen Lawrence was a young black man, who at the age of 18 was brutally murdered in a hate crime in South London in 1993. He had dreams of becoming an architect in the future and he sadly lost his life in an unprovoked attack. After that, this Trust was created in his honour, not only to avoid terrible tragedies like this, but also to give opportunites to the Black youth in the UK and give them information and support they need to succeed. That is an honourable cause, that we are very grateful to be contributing to as a community.

So we sold roses to our students in Years 11, 12 and 13 as well as our staff. For each rose sold, we added etiquettes with inspirational and educational quotes by important black people, that helped shape history and that had an impact on Black culture. We had politicians, singers, athletes, activists to again spread positivity and inspiration to everyone.

We are delighted to have raised £429.

On behalf of our team, we would like to thank everyone who has supported the creation of this project and anyone who bought roses and supported this cause.

Jack Petchey Achievement Awards 2020

The Jack Petchey Foundation provided Awards for 6 students during 2020 and these have been awarded to students across a range of year groups for a variety of reasons. Certificates for these achievements will be shared in the Spring Term when all students are back in school. The Award winners have purchased a variety of items to benefit numerous students within the school.

Together with Professor Nicola Pitchford from the University of Nottingham, Tiasha is co-hosting a film on FGM called 'In the name of your daughter'. Their vision is to raise awareness & support about the plight of girls vulnerable to FGM.

She went further to independently reach out and work upon a range of past and current initiatives including:

- 1. She is a member of the Co-RAY advisory group at University of Oxford, chaired by Professor Cathy Creswell
- 2. Co-authoring a piece for Reachwell.org with Prof Townsend from University of Nottingham.
- 3. Contributing to the user interface design of a Covid-19 Awareness App
- 4. She also volunteered at Merton library.

Tiasha is celebrating her Award with her form by hosting a pizza and cake lunch on the last day of term in the canteen. She is also purchasing table tennis bats and balls that can be used on the outdoor tables behind drama during breaks.

Marissa in Year 8 provided peer support to a student within her year group. She was calm, sensible and reassuring. Marissa purchased chocolate for her form group, who were delighted and she will be supporting a school event which is taking place in 2021.



Sophia gave support to another student who was unable to attend school due to illness. She arranged for the student's AV1 (a robot which connects the classroom to a remote device) to be placed in her classroom every day so that the student could participate in lessons while she was away from school. This was a daily commitment. Sophia has purchased books costing £250 for the school library which everyone will be able to enjoy.

Manna who was in 8M when she gained her Award was a founding member of the robotics club and she promoted it at Year 7 assembly as well as participating in the competitions. Her £250 Award has been spent on equipment for the robotics club including an Education Spike Prime Set by Lego. This is used to teach simple coding lessons or solve complex real-world problems in engineering design and computer science.

Jamie in Year 13 organised a team of sixth form students to create a weekly 'Quarantine Chronicles' for the rest of the school during lockdown. This involved publishing articles and activities for students to read and do during school closure.

Jamie has purchased chocolate for the publishing team and is donating the remaining funds to the Art department to purchase equipment for the exam groups.

Aleesha in Year 10 gained her award following a nomination by her Head of Year Ms Shortt and her English teacher Ms Stead. Aleesha has worked hard since year 9 and excelled in her subjects and shown a huge improvement in her level of engagement. In particular, Aleesha has gone above and beyond in English, spending her own time listening to a specialist podcast on Macbeth and reading around the subject. Aleesha is going to be celebrating with her form group in the Spring Term.

A special mention to Lauren in Year 11 who was nominated for her commitment to music. Lauren received an Award in Year 8 for different reasons and therefore can't receive a second award. Well done!

A judging panel from STEM and industry wrote feedback to participants, and electronic certificates were given to all entrants.

Starting with a convincing and lively pitch, and progressing through all aspects of residents' daily lives, Mission Ares really did a great job of communicating its message to us. Srutiga in Year 8 won a Silver Award for her project - Martia - The Martian Bubble.




