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## MESSAGES FROM MS CAVILLA



Dear parents, carers and students,

We are delighted that students at our school submitted so many entries to the national Art competition called "The Fourth Plinth Award" to decide which piece gets to be exhibited on the fourth plinth of Trafalgar Square. You can read about our award winner below. Art and DT put the A into STEAM, which is wider than STEM and celebrates the creative talent we have at the school.

You will also read about the further student leadership positions awarded recently. We are currently going out for new students to join the CARE Committee so there are more opportunities to come.

I also have two items that I am asking for parental support on:

#### **Attendance**

As you will see in Mrs Williamson-Jones' section on attendance and messages from the sixth form team, the school experienced a significant drop in attendance from Year 12 students the week before last. We wrote home to Year 12 parents to ask for support in highlighting the importance of sustaining attendance in the run up to the Year 12 exams. Despite this, attendance fell further to just 68% on Friday May 3rd. Staff plan lessons to include revision and consolidation in the journey towards examinations. These internal examinations are not the final destination and whilst students may believe they get there faster by revision-cramming, this approach is not backed up by evidence and research into how information is stored in longer-term memory. Please work with us on this. The school will seek medical evidence for such absences.

#### **Mobile phones**

Our school rule is that mobile phones should not be visible once students are on the school site. We are seeing an increase in mobile phone use before school and after Period 5 but before leaving school site. Our message is clear – phones should not be out whilst on the school site. We are reminding students and staff on duty so please support the school in reinforcing those messages.

We have been delighted with the increased response we got to the parent survey having extended the deadline and are grateful to all who responded.

## **UPDATES FROM MRS WILLIAMSON-JONES**

#### **Attendance**

Thank you for your continued support with your child's attendance. We continue to be proud of our school's attendance figures and that Nonsuch is a place where students want to attend and learn.

This week has seen our attendance figures drop slightly to below 96% for the first time this year. The decline is attributed to student absences occurring before and during internal exams, with notable decreases observed among Y12 students.

Supporting your child to attend school is important, particularly around examination periods. If your child is ill please remember that if this were their GCSE or A-Level exam they would be required to still attend. The Government provides parents with guidance around illness and attendance at school. The Government recommends that children with mild respiratory illnesses, such as a minor cough, runny nose, or sore throat, can typically attend school. You can monitor your child's attendance data through the School Gateway app and ensure that it remains at 95% and above. If there is anything that we may be concerned about, your child's form tutor, Head of Year or myself will contact you.

# Class Charts and First Aid notification

We have recently made changes to the Class Charts system to allow it to trigger an alert to our first aid staff to let us know that a child has left their lesson. ### **UKMT Mathematical Challenge**

We are delighted with the outstanding set of results from students in Y7 and 8 at the recent UKMT Junior Mathematical Challenge. We had 177 students in Y7 and Y8 sitting the hour-long challenge on Thursday April 25th. Students across the two years achieved 98 Gold, 55 Silver, 12 Bronze and 12 certificates of participation. In Y7, Thea, Tiahni, Olivia and Najibah all scored 123 and were awarded the Gold Best in Year Certificate, while in Y8, Isabella and Sophie both scored 129 and were awarded the Gold Best in School Certificate. A follow-on round is to take place on June 11th, with 74 students qualifying to take part. The six students named above are invited to take part in the two-hour Junior Mathematical Olympiad, with the remaining students invited to take part in the one-hour Junior Kangaroo.
