UPDATES FROM MS OSBORNE

Attendance

Attending school every day can help your child to achieve their aspirations, and the aspirations you have for them. School attendance is also important for giving them the enrichment opportunities that can help support their social and mental wellbeing.

The research on the link between attendance and attainment is clear; the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

We appreciate that it can be difficult to know whether your child is too ill to attend school. However, NHS guidance is clear that it is fine to send them in with a minor cough or common cold, provided they don't have a temperature.

We aim for all our students to have an attendance rate of 95% of above. You can monitor your child's attendance data through the Schoolgateway app and ensure that it remains at this rate. If there is anything that we may be concerned about, your child's form tutor, Head of Year, or I will contact you.

New guidance on attendance

In February, the Government published new guidance for attendance which became statutory in August. These changes reflect amendments to the law and are part of the Government's drive to improve attendance at school. Deails are here, along with links to wider guidance on supporting your child's attendance. The full guidance is here.

A reminder that the Government has an <u>attendance hub</u> which can help parents make informed decisions about attendance. The Government also provides parents with guidance around illness and attendance at school. This <u>guidance</u> helps parents make informed decisions about their child's health and attendance.



We also visited the 'Bear Garden'- a common seating area given its name by Queen Victoria. We ended the trip by visiting the Temple church, a beautiful building featuring multiple statues of William Marshal, which brought back many happy memories for most of us from our GCSE History specification. The trip was an invaluable experience, and we all found the case hearing and places explored fascinating.



Right Respecting Schools Steering Group - Holocaust Memorial Day

Sahasra and Anukarnika (Y9) write: The UNCRC aims to educate and raise awareness of our rights.

Our contribution this week outlines Articles 8, 19, 24 and 27 from the UNCRC to highlight the importance of Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD), which takes place on Monday January 27th. This year, HMD marks the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi concentration camp complex, and the 30th anniversary of the genocide in Bosnia.



Article 8 states that every child has a right to an identity and that the respective Government(s) should respect and protect that right and prevent the child's name, nationality or family relationships from being changed unlawfully. Article 19 states that every child has the right to be safe from any form of violence, while Article 24 states that every child has the right to the best health and health services.

The perpetrators of the Holocaust and all other genocides violated these rights unutterably.

Holocaust Memorial Day is a day of remembrance of those not only killed in the Holocaust but also in many other atrocities, such as in Cambodia in the 1970s and Rwanda in the 1990s. HMD makes us as a community think about our basic rights and our freedom and opportunities. We must not to take these privileges for granted. We encourage you to visit Holocaust Memorial Day Trust to read more about the significance and importance of this day.

- Clarification of language around Pupil Premium, changing "in receipt of Pupil Premium" to "eligible for"
- The addition of 'young carer' as a category as part of the prioritisation for Sixth Form places and an additional Supplementary Information Form to submit supporting evidence.
- Clarification of when offers to Sixth Form are made.
- Clarification of the process about mid-term admissions to years 10 and 11.
