
Sutton Mental Health Foundation offers events and activities are free to anyone over the age of 18 living in the London Borough of Sutton, who needs support with their mental health.


Pollen forecasts are high. If your child has hayfever, please make sure that they take their medication before coming to school. Many thanks.

SCHOOL NEWS

Physics - Y12



Five A-Level Physics students recently attended the annual Higgs' Lecture at King's College London on Wednesday June 5th. This year's speaker was the Michael Faraday Prize and Royal Medal Winner, Dame Jocelyn Bell Burnell. Her discoveries in radio astronomy as a PhD student at Cambridge contributed to Sir Martin Ryles and Anthony Hewish's Noble Prize in 1972. The lecture was focused on transient events particularly Gamma-ray bursts and Active Galactic Nuclei. What made the lecture particularly relevant for Year 12s was her emphasis on how the future of astronomy is deeply integrated in rapidly advancing technologies, such as machine learning and AI.



The students also kindly brought back Dame Bell Burnell's autograph back to Nonsuch! She is an incredibly inspiring role model and is known for her work to improve diversity in science such as winning a US\$3m prize and donating it to fund graduate scholarships for people from under-represented groups to study physics.
