UPDATES FROM MS OSBORNE

Attendance

Attending school every day can help your child to achieve their aspirations, and the aspirations you have for them. School attendance is also important for giving them the enrichment opportunities that can help support their social and mental wellbeing.

The research on the link between attendance and attainment is clear; the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

We appreciate that it can be difficult to know whether your child is too ill to attend school. However, NHS guidance is clear that it is fine to send them in with a minor cough or common cold, provided they don't have a temperature.

We aim for all our students to have an attendance rate of 95% of above. You can monitor your child's attendance data through the Schoolgateway app and ensure that it remains at this rate. If there is anything that we may be concerned about, your child's form tutor, Head of Year, or I will contact you.

Even when replying to a text, please follow the route below.

Please also note that attachments cannot be sent via the Schoolgateway. Therefore, if you are required to supply any evidence for an absence, please email attachments to office@nonsuchschool.org. Please refer to the PDF sent with this newsletter for a reminder of absence reporting either side of a school holiday.

Unfortunately, this is due to the set-up within Schoolgateway and is unavoidable.

Sutton Neurodevelopmental Needs One Stop Shop

Support and advice for families with neurodevelopmental (ND) related needs like social skills, concentration levels or coping with change.

A new drop-in service for Sutton families of children and young people aged between 5-18, with challenges which may be related to a neurodevelopmental presentation (Autism or ADHD). This could include emotional difficulties, behavioural challenges, problems with sleep, friendship issues, sensory difficulties, attention and concentration difficulties, and hyperactivity and impulsivity. Our health and care professionals can provide information, advice and signposting, and help you access services.

- Drop-in service - no need to book
- Supportive and friendly environment.
- Attend as a family, on your own or with other people who care for the young person (young people must be accompanied)
- All families from Sutton are welcome, whether or not you are on a waiting list
- No diagnosis needed
- Attending will not change your position on any waiting list

Year 12 trip to the Churchill War Rooms

Last week, Y12 historians visited the Churchill War Rooms in London. Understanding the life and times of Winston Churchill forms a key part of their Unit 1 studies and this trip certainly helped to develop their understanding of Churchill's life before and during the Second World War. Located underneath Whitehall, the War Rooms have been perfectly preserved from when Churchill occupied them during the Second World War, giving us a real sense of the history of the dramatic days of 1940. Even the most Churchill-sceptic historians said they loved the trip and now want us to take them to Chartwell, Churchill's former home.

DT trip to Numatic, home of Henry Hoover

Last week, Year 9 and 10 students travelled to Chard, Somerset to visit the Numatic Factory, home of the iconic 'Henry Hoover.'

We were greeted by Zoe a mechanical design engineer who is responsible for designing parts of the machinery which make various vacuum cleaners manufactured at Numatic. She delivered a presentation on the different types of engineering, career paths into engineering and the importance of the skills gained in Design and Technology to become 'creative problem solvers'.

We learnt about robots, cobots and the use of AI and that this is an area that will continue to develop in the near future. We were also given an insight into how companies, like Numatic, turn commitments to sustainability into reality through the development of recycling and energy-efficient systems.

Students were then taken on a tour of the factory, where they observed different stages of the production process, including injection and rotational moulding, assembly, and quality control. This gave a clear insight into how design and engineering principles are used in a real working environment.

The STEM task to build a Henry Hoover without instructions in teams which included a quiz where we had to apply our DT knowledge of materials and manufacturing techniques – Henry also had some clues to help us inside. Finally, we had a speed race to see how fast each team could assemble their Henry Hoover! Thank you to the members of staff who accompanied the students and to the team at Numatic for their time and for providing such a valuable learning experience for our students.

Sustainability at Nonsuch
