## UPDATES FROM MS OSBORNE

#### **Attendance**

Attending school every day can help your child to achieve their aspirations, and the aspirations you have for them. School attendance is also important for giving them the enrichment opportunities that can help support their social and mental wellbeing.

The research on the link between attendance and attainment is clear; the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

We appreciate that it can be difficult to know whether your child is too ill to attend school. However, NHS guidance is clear that it is fine to send them in with a minor cough or common cold, provided they don't have a temperature.

We aim for all our students to have an attendance rate of 95% of above. You can monitor your child's attendance data through the Schoolgateway app and ensure that it remains at this rate. If there is anything that we may be concerned about, your child's form tutor, Head of Year, or I will contact you.

#### Schoolgateway absence reminder

We have noticed an increased number of absence messages that are not being received in the attendance area of the Schoolgateway. If absences are not reported following the route below the Attendance Officer is not automatically notified and your daughter's reason for absence will not be recorded. Even when replying to a text, please follow the route below.

Please also note that attachments cannot be sent via the Schoolgateway. Therefore, if you are required to supply any evidence for an absence, please email attachments to <a href="mailto:office@nonsuchschool.org">office@nonsuchschool.org</a>. Please refer to the PDF sent with this newsletter for a reminder of absence reporting either side of a school holiday.


# SAFEGUARDING AND WELLBEING

#### **Celebrating Black History Month at Nonsuch**

First established in the USA, Black History Month (BHM) made its way to the UK in October 1987 thanks to the efforts of Ghanaian journalist and campaigner Akyaaba Sebo. Witnessing first-hand the way young Black Britons were made to feel ashamed of their cultures, he aimed to highlight the Black community's contributions to world civilisations throughout history. Overcoming racist stigmas and celebrating heritage that has been overlooked or dismissed, are both central tenets of BHM, making this year's theme of 'Standing Firm in Power and Pride' especially poignant.

This year's events included Nonsuch's first BHM Essay Competition, in which students chose one of five questions to showcase their writing skills. Well done to our runners-up, Sumedha (Y9) and Nishka M (Y10), and congratulations to Mawara (Y7) and Mithuna (Y11) for winning the KS3 and KS4 categories! Their winning essays will be published in the school magazine. We were overwhelmed by the number of students who took part, so thank you all for your submissions; you should all be extremely proud.

Alongside the essay competition, our Jeopardy Quiz was a big success, with a huge audience coming to watch teachers and students go head-to-head and test their knowledge of Black History. The staff were victorious in what proved to be an exhilarating contest.

The canteen staff cooked a wonderful Caribbean and African inspired lunch which included for example: jerk chicken & wedges, rice and peas and puff puff for dessert. Thank you to Mrs Kite and her fantastic team in the canteen!

Students also had the chance to learn more about Black history by taking part in our annual scavenger hunt. Well done to everyone who discovered the wise and very relevant words of Nelson Mandela: 'Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world.'

The week culminated in the staff and students wearing red, which was part of the campaign: Show Racism the Red Card.


