


Behaviour score breakdown







Attendance

1. Attendance expectations – 97%

"It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure that their child attends school on time every day that the school is open."

2. Punctuality

"The school recognises occasions where students may arrive late to school and this cannot be helped because of external issues. However, these are rare event"

No leave of absence will be authorised after the Easter holidays up until May half-term, during HE days and during Work Experience week.





SIXTH FORM BURSARY

- The 16-19 Bursary Scheme, also known as the Sixth Form Bursary Scheme, provides financial support to students to help them to succeed in their studies. It is funded by the government and administered by the school.
- All our students are eligible to apply for a sixth form bursary but we only have a limited pot of money each year from the government to fund the scheme. Prioritisation will be given for those students who demonstrate the most financial need.
- Applications Are Open: 3 September
- Applications Deadline: 25 September
- Bursary Panels: w/c 7 October
- Initial Payments: 21 October

WHAT CAN THE FUNDING BE SPENT ON?

The funding provided can only be used to address financial difficulties in accessing education in the Sixth Form and cannot be spent on general living expenses. Some examples of eligible items which the fund can be used to pay for include:

- Transport costs for commuting to and from school.
- Essential books and equipment that are relevant to the courses being studied and not already provided.
- Educational trips necessary for the curriculum.
- Clothing to meet the Sixth Form dress code or specialised clothing.
- Meals during school hours.
- Travel expenses for university open days or similar events.
- Fees for university entrance tests, such as UCAT, and similar exams.
