	Themes/ Concepts that are built upon In year's 7 & 8 students will have learnt how to discuss what makes a performance good based on achieving intentions. This will build on the Point Explain and Analyse structure that they learn in order to describe why something was successful (both orally and written)
	Help Future Learning Recap of terminology from Year 7-9 to ensure that key skills are understood to introduced new styles throughout the year. This links directly to AQA GCSE Drama written exam and will allow them to get a basis for expectations at a GCSE level.
	Systematic Building of Vocabulary Pupils have a toolkit that was created in Y7, a new and improved version can be created. This allows pupils to identify key terms and their definitions. At the end of the unit there can be an option to reflect on this with RAG. Pupils are proactively asked to use these skills and techniques in practice. Physical evidence of them in performance can support their understanding of the definition.
